



# **Budding architect Priya Nakhate finds** 'spaces' very interesting and important


PRIYA Nakhate, of the Institute of Design Education and Architectural Studies (IDEAS), Nagpur, won second prize in the Studio Design competition organised by IIA recently. Sharing her views about the competition and project Priya stated; "Sharing my experience, this six-day working studio for Prof S A Deshpande Studio Design Competition provided me a platform where I could use my creativity and imagination which is otherwise not possible in academics. We were supposed to design retreats for 11 writers on a bridge with an allegory."

As well quoted by famous architect Louis Kahn "Architecture is thoughtful making of space". A space where eleven writers would congregate at a common platform to share their thoughts and opinion. The writer also needs an isolated space to bake these thoughts turning them into a delicious cookje, a book.

'On a bridge of Allegories - A bridge; the first image which comes into our mind is a structure providing a passage across two points. But is this thought enough? My interpretation of bridge after reading the brief was, that: A bridge not only connects two points but it is the journey between two points, a journey, which can be manipulated to create a new experience. A bridge where there is a writer's nexus. A retreat away from the real world to the world of his own. But have you wondered, how block is turned into a dwelling?

The answer is 'Reflection'. Our essence, our character, when instilled into a block becomes a dwelling. My design concept is an allegory of a wandering writer hunting for an idea, exploring the new routes with an impression in mind "Why to be still when the world is moving."

A design where eleven writers have a common platform to share their thoughts along with an isolated space maintaining

their privacy, their dwelling which can be transformed according to their mood. The concept of a transforming dwelling is presented in resemblance with a writer's character - capricious and volatile, where walls can be turned into a balcony, a roof opening up to the sky and windows acting as a plane to sit and enjoy the nature. A dwelling symbolises their characters, like a drama genre has an inverted house with hidden allegory -'Jo dekhta hai voh hota nahi.' And so are others.

An aerial rope way is introduced in my design as a unique mode of transportation against the conventional stairways and ramps. This is done to inspire the writers by providing them an alleyway to get close with nature's aesthetic beauty and its stunning wonders which would not have been possible otherwise".


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# 6-century-old stepwell 'found' in ruins by college

# Great Discovery, Will Definitely Preserve: Expert

Nagpur: In 1998, the pursuit for a picturesque landscape took a fine-arts student to Wela Harichandra village — around 12 kilometres from Nagpur. There, in the middle of nowhere, he stumbled upon a ruin and spent hours sketching it.

Manoj Bhanuse, then, didn't know that he had stepped into an over 600-year-old stepwell built by the Bhonsalas. In Vidarbha, step wells are known as 'bavadis', 'bahuli' or ''pairyachivihir'.

The ancient structure didn't catch the eye of heritage conservationists but it did excite a group of college students and lecturers who began to document it in 2010. That year students of the Institute of Design Education and Architecture Studies (IDEAS) were discussing locations for the documentation of sites having prominent architectural elements. Bhanuse, who is now working as an assistant professor in the college, thought back on the ancient structure.

"Isuggested the stepwell was an ideal subject," he told TOI on Thursday.

The research on the

step well started soon according to associate professor Kirti Bhonsle who is also one of the authors of the documentation.

"We found that despite being a unique contribution to architectural herita-

by the ASI.

Confirming that it is not mentioned in the heritage list, architect Ashok Mok-

ge, the stepwell hardly has a recorded history," she says. In April 2016, British scientist Philip Earis, who was mapping 'India's forgotten stepwells', read the documentation and came all the way to Nagpur to visit this site, adds Bhonsle.

Since almost eight years, the college is documenting the structure which is completely in a shambles. Bhanúse claims his sketch showed two-three arches and sculp tures. But a récent visit by the students and faculty revealed that many elementshave gone missing.

"A large part of the structure has collapsed. Such stepwells are well preserved in Gujarat but it is disheartening to see such a beautiful piece of architecture with intricate carvings in this pitiable condition," says assistant professor Stuti Vij Pincha, who took a group of students to the site on Wednesday for the latest documentation.

On Thursday, TOI visited the site and found it to be littered with plastic and other waste. Though locals don't know its exact history, they narrated some folklores passed down from generations.

The team worked on the structural design of the historic building that houses The Hitavada office



CITY'S heritage structure 'The Hitavada' building has been selected in top 10 heritage structures at national-level. A team of Institute of Design Education and Architectural Studies (IDEAS) who had worked on documentation of historic buildings that included the building of *The Hitavada* has been emerged as the only institute to get all entries selected among 10 structures at the national-level.

Council of Architecture (COA) instituted award for excellence in documentation of Architectural Heritage in India. COA heritage awards were instituted with an objective to encourage interest and talent of students for understanding, documentation of heritage buildings and to develop sensitivity and awareness towards India's Architectural Heritage amongst students of Architecture across the country.

IDEAS participated in COA 2018 student awards for excellence in documentation in architectural heritage. IDEAS participated with three entries and all these entries have been selected at Zonal Level Round held in Vishakhapanam. Further, out of the 25 entries selected for National level, all these three entries of IDEAS were selected

amongst top 10 entries. Students of IDEAS got recognition at national level and special recognition was given to documentation of 'The Hitavada' for heritage awards at national level held at Bhagwan Mahaveer School of Architecture, Sonepat, Haryana. This work along with other nine short listed entries would be published by COA for circulation at national and international level.

# Architecture students come up with 'Ideas' for smart Nagpur

NAGPUR is no doubt trying to become a smart city, at least, on paper. But citizens are trying hard to draw attention of authorities concerned towards the things which can be put in place to make Nagpur look smart. One such attempt was made by Institute of Design Education and Architectural Studies. It organised a summer studies workshop, a 15 days studio program for students. This was done to explore the co-curriculum academic activities which could not be covered in regular syllabus and give students an exposure about architecture, culture society and their own city. Responding to it, students came up with several ideas.

The topics of the study were -Urban Design Studies, Green Design Studies Landscape Design, Appropriate Technology Studies, Vernacular Design Studies, Rural Design Studies, Art Appreciation Studies and Tracing Climate Responsive Studies. The aim of the Summer Study was to make students aware about the wide range of studies in the field, which they can use in their further design projects.

Of the seven studies, three --Landscape Design Studies, Green Design Studies and Urban Design Studies -- focused mainly on making Nagpur a Smart City.

Landscape Design Studies had a very unique approach towards process-oriented design; the objective of this studies was to trigger clues through literature describing constitution and usage of open space and its creative process of developing abstract through derived key words, leading to a design proposal of open space for identified relevant city pockets.

Various abandoned and underutilised sites like Medical Garden, Shantinagar, Futalalake front, Police Talao within the city were selected and studied thoroughly for assessment of present day requirement to frame the proposal. Innovative land-

scape proposals for these areas like -healinggarden, plazas, water fronts and others were resulted. The project gave the students an altogether unique way to study and analyse spaces and anchor clues from text to arrive at solutions.

Green Design Studies, was about dving Nag river, which has lent its name to the city. Of the 18 km, long path, four patches were identified and worked on by documenting the past image of the spot, the history of the river, the growth of civilization around the patch, the current scenario and the situation that have led to it. And analysed the details to have come up with the solutions, which are applicable on the approachable basis. Two out of the four patches, i.e. Sanagmeshwar and Tulsi Bagh are the heritage worthy spots whose present pictures are pitiful. With the help of Nagpur, Municipal Corporation (NMC) and through interview and questionnaire-based survey the project has initiated a public participa-

on the minds of future architects to work more on the worthy river of the city.

Urban design studio had groups working on urban level in 2 cities, Nagpur and Kolkata. Nagpur city study was done with the objective of understanding and analyzing evolution informal of vegetable markets or bazaar in the city, based on various parameters through which 3 major bazars in the city - Gokul Peth, cotton market and Budhwar Bazar, Mahal were studied. The process of the design studio was in itself a learning process.

Documentation gave the students a better insight about the working and mood of the market area. This has sensitised them about acknowledging and considering various aspects of the market and public, which they will use in coming up with contemporary and modern proposals for the market in future project
